"Having come down in a cloud, the Lord stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, 'Lord.' A WORD FROM PAX CHRISI METRO NEW YORK

Trinity Sunday does not get the recognition of so many other feast days, like Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost; yet, it is truly a wonderful holy day, worthy of great attention and celebration. It is on Trinity Sunday that we honor the totality and oneness of God as Divine Parent, Incarnate Son, and Holy Spirit. And the readings of this Sunday present the joy and promise of this extraordinary feast from start to finish. In the first reading we are told that God is a "merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." In the second reading we read "the God of love and peace will be with you." And in the Gospel we learn that "God so loved the world that God gave the only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."
